- explore options for pre-reunion events to discuss key topics including free speech at the University, the resignation of President Gay, anti-Semitism and anti-Muslim activity, and affirmative action in higher education. We welcome suggestions about classmates and Harvard faculty who might be resources or speakers.
- form a reunion subcommittee to address current controversial topics before and during the reunion. The reunion schedule is tight and Harvard spaces are scarce the Science Center is closed due to renovation, and all reunions are happening at the same time. - advocate to the Harvard Alumni Association (HAA) to encourage a reimagining of Harvard Alumni Day on Friday, May 31 to allow space for constructive discussions about the challenging issues facing the Harvard community.

We hope to bring classmates together at the 35th to renew old connections, form new friendships, and deepen our understanding about our journeys and the changes at Harvard over the last 35 years. Our loyalty is to each other and we are grateful for many aspects of our shared college experiences.
